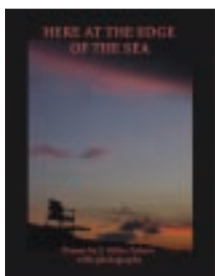

6 THE PASSERBY



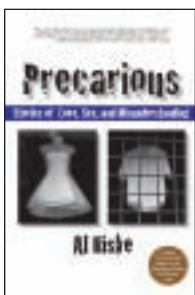

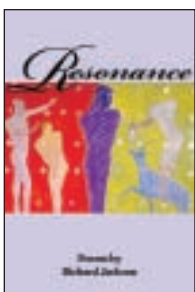
7 **PRECARIOUS**

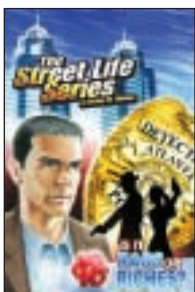
8 **RESONANCE**

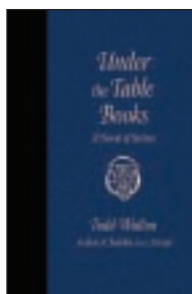
10 **A SUFI'S GHOST**
